



COMMON PET EMERGENCIES

Please call us immediately if you suspect any of these signs of trauma or toxicities in your pet.



XYLITOL POISONING

Sugar free gum and candy, tooth paste, and even peanut butter may contain this sugar substitute. If your pet has ingested even a small amount, call us immediately.



HUMAN MEDICATIONS

A handbag left unattended or medication left in reach of a curious pet can have serious consequences for your pets. Keep all human medication items out of their reach and sight.



TRAUMA FROM BITES

Injuries from bites from other pets or wildlife can present poisoning and infection dangers. If you suspect your pet has been bitten, give us a call.



VEHICLE IMPACTS

Accidents happen quickly – it only takes a split second for a pet to dash out the door into a busy street. If your pet has been hit by a car, truck or bicycle, call us immediately.



HEAT STROKE

Be mindful of your pet's comfort in the heat. Never leave a pet in a hot car, monitor paws on walks to reduce chances of pavement burns, and make sure plenty of cold water is present. Be especially careful with brachycephalic dogs, such as Pugs, Boston Terriers, Bulldogs or any other dog that has a short snout, as it's more difficult for them to cool down.
